

Brantingham Parish Council



National Grid Electricity Transmission is consulting on proposals to reinforce the high voltage electricity transmission network between a new substation at Creyke Beck, to the north of Hull, and a new substation at High Marnham in Nottinghamshire.

The first stage of public consultation has now started, and Brantingham Parish Council has been contacted as the parish is located within 1 km of the National Grid's emerging preferred corridor. The plan involves erecting new pylons along the proposed route, at this stage we don't know their number or the height.

After viewing the plans at the last Parish Council meeting, there is a consensus for a preferred route. This would be to have the new pylons to the north side of the existing transmission line, to have less impact on the village. After crossing the A63/Cave Road area, we would like to see the line switched and the southern corridor utilised to reduce the impact on Ellerker and not surround Ellerker Village with pylons. There is no perfect solution, but we believe this route would impact the least number of properties and residents.

The Parish Council understands that residents may have concerns and therefore we would like to invite you to attend our next Parish Council meeting at Brantingham Village Hall on **Monday 24th July at 7 pm** where we will be discussing the issue further.
