**Item 1 Minutes of the last meeting**

These were accepted as a true record and signed by the chairman.

**Item 2 Matters arising and outstanding**

**Pond Issues** – Richard Powell has spoken to Steven Murray of ERYC regarding silt traps. He was advised that there is no funding available for this. If this is something, we would like to do it would be down to the PC to fund. However, Steven Murray suggested that the Community Payback scheme might be a possible source of manpower to desilt the pond once a year.

The ducks were re-homed when Keith Sanderson did some work on the pond. Liz Livison has offered to give us some duck for the pond, alternatively we could purchase some. It was agreed that Richard Shillaker should purchase some ducks.

Glenda asked about the work Chris Norfolk had offered to do linking the beck to the pond. Richard Meredith commented that there is a drainage and sewer problem in the area and Yorkshire Water have some funding and hope to start work on lining some pipes.

**Ditch in front of the Village Hall** – Drain Issue – This is ongoing Richard Powell needs to review this with Andrew Milner.

**No Cycling Signs** – The metal signs have arrived. The footpath volunteers have them and they should go up within the next week. Sam McGivern also has some signs and it will be a case of whoever works their way to the area the quickest will put them up She had had a meeting with PCSO Lynch about the issue of motorbikes and cyclists on public rights of way.

**Litter Bin** – The new bin has been installed and has been placed near Ionians. The cost to the PC is £100 plus vat, i.e. the installation cost (ERYC are funding purchase of the bin).

**Dr Peter Halkon Petuaria Revisited** – The meeting due to be held on 17<sup>th</sup> November, unfortunately had to be cancelled. It is hoped to rearrange the talk either January or February.

**Flooding and drainage** – There are about 3 points where the springs have burst sending water onto Dale Road. The worst is close to the old quarry. Richard Shillaker did take some photographs showing the water flowing onto the road and then cascading off the road into the beck.

A channel has been dug by a villager to take water off the road near the sheep wash.

Richard Shillaker has reported the flooding to Highways (ref 1224455) and is concerned there could be a potential skid risk (if the water on the road froze) and about the downstream consequences of such a rush of water.

Richard Powell has spoken to Steven Murray at Highways about the problem.

**Dog Mess** – We are concerned about the amount of dog owners leaving poo bags on footpaths, in bushes and hanging on trees. Louise's draft notice was agreed. The notice will put on the notice board in the village and on the website asking dog owners to clean up after their dogs.

**Church Green Track** – We are aware that this is used as a turning circle and the entrance to the track is looking messy and very muddy. It was agreed that there is nothing the PC can do to prevent this happening and to leave it as it is.

Defibrillator - check battery and reported as ok.

### **Item 3 Finance**

Budget 2020/21 – Our application for the precept for the next financial year needs to be submitted by 17<sup>th</sup> January 2020. This can be discussed at our next meeting.

### **Item 4 Planning applications and policy consideration**

19/03366 Ivy Cottage Main Street Brantingham – Planning permission has already been granted and the new application is just making some alteration. The main change is the Orangery, this would not be seen from the main road. We feel that although planning permission has been granted little of the original cottage remains. Richard Powell has declared an interest in the application.

We note the conservation officer has made some comments. It was agreed not to submit any comments to ERYC about this application.

19/03910 The Coach House Brantingham court Thorp Drive Brantingham. Richard Skewis attended part of the meeting to give his views on the application as he is submitting an objection.

After Richard left, the PC discussed the application and agreed the proposed driveway would alter the visual appearance of the Coach House and affect the adjoining property and therefore we will be objecting.

**Item 5 Planning Permission**

19/03524 Brantingham Village Hall Trustees – Construction of an access ramp – Planning permission granted. Work is hoped to start sometime in March.

Tina Wyatt sent an email regarding leaves on Dale Road. The leaves have been swept up and Richard Powell has replied to Tina.

Mess outside the post office – Richard Powell has spoken to the contractions working in the area.

Post Office Light – We feel that Rupert should pay the disconnection charge as the light is on his property. The PC are happy to consider replacing the light to match others in the village, the cost to us is approximately £1,600.00. This is something to consider when discussing the budget for the next year.
