**Emergency Plan** – To be approve at the AGM.

**Pond** – Richard Shillaker reported that the Barley Strew has been placed in the pond. There is some algae scum, on the pond, this could be a result of silt running into the pond from the road. The Duck feeding signs and parking signs are starting to look dull. Richard Powell has the new duck signs ready to put up and will print off some new parking signs.

There is mud on the road, this is running into the pond, this will need digging out. Richard Powell will do this when he installs the new benches

We note there are dog owners not cleaning up dog mess around the pond.

**Barrier Repair/Bollards near the Beck** – ERYC have been contacted and we are witing for a response. Linda has left messages and will keep chasing this up.

**Cave Road** – Richard Powell has spoken to Stephen Murry at ERYC, and they are intending to sweep the paths along Cave Road once the contractors currently working have finished. The grass cutting should be on the ERYC grass cutting schedule.

**Platinum Jubilee** – Richard Powell has applied to the ERYC for a grant in the sum of five hundred pounds to help with the of the Jubilee celebrations. ERYC have confirmed the application has been accepted and we should receive the funds shortly. The ERYC have confirmed the road near the pond will be closed off on Sunday 4<sup>th</sup> June from 7am to 7pm. Signs will be put up in advance to say the road will be closed.

Flyers have been sent out advertising the event to most of the village and the postman has kindly offered to deliver to the residents down Cave Road.

Richard has had some banners printing and will be putting them up around the village.

The recent tree planting around the village can be used as community paid back in support of our grant application.

**Work Party (litter and paths)** – A community Group and Terry Gill have organised a local litter pick recently. As this has just been done, we will wait until later in the year to hold another litter pick. We note that someone has been fly tipping and has left a pile of rubbish including an asbestos pipe. ERYC has been alerted about this and has now been dealt with. We note that some of the bins have not been emptied, ERYC have said this is because they are understaffed. Simon Caffery and Richard Shillaker are very keen on tidying the village and have cleared and edged the paths from the Triton down to Ionions.

**State of track to Church Green** Richard Shillaker has spoken to John Levison about the track as this is the entrance to John's field. Richard Shillaker does not think anything will be done to improve the track. Richard Powell has been and had a look at the track and thinks it's not too bad at present.

**Litter Bin at Cackle Pits layby** – Pat Smith will investigate this.

**Contamination of the Beck** – Richard Powell noticed a few weeks ago grey bubbly water coming out of the pipe from the Village Green leading to the Beck. Richard contacted Yorkshire Water, who came out to investigate. They will come back and put a camera down the pipe to see if they can identify where the problem is.

**Road Grips** – This has now been dealt with but feel that we need to look at Burrill's Lane as there is often standing water. Pat will speak to Richard Meredith regarding this.

**Benches** – Richard Powell has the new benches he will deal with installing them in due course. Richard Powell has had a site meeting with Sam McGivern with regards placing a memorial bench for John Whiteley at the top of Spout Hill. Whilst Sam was not in favour of a new bench, the bench would not be on Highways land and has suggested that any bench, we would like to install should be the same design of the existing one nearby. ERYC could supply and install for £1,200.00. This is also something we could purchase for around £500.00

**Beech Tree Trimming** – Nik has submitted planning permission for the trees to be trimmed. This has now been approved.

**Cycle Paths** – Earlier in the year we put BPC'S name to a letter South Cave PC were sending to ERYC regarding footpaths and cycle paths, from South Cave to Brough. ERYC have responded saying that the scheme proposed is outside the scope of the Traffic Management Team alone, so would have to consider and collate a response from several of their departments.

The scheme would be costly and would need to apply for central government funding. At present due to the low usage of this route compared to the excessive costs, it could not attract sufficient funding to make it viable, and so the scheme cannot be progressed at this time.

**Path and Roadways in Brantingham** – Richard Powell has meet with Steve Murry and looked around the village and has agreed that some of the roads and paths are in need of repair. They will need to look at funding but may do some remedial work over the summer or when the budget allows.

**Grass Cutting/Street Cleaning** –Brough Town Council were hoping to employ someone as a grounds person and to split the cost with BPC. They had managed to employ someone, but they only lasted a day. South Cave employ someone through Staff Force, this is a route we could consider. In the mean time we will ask Georgi to do what he can and try to get some help if needed.

**Petuaria Revisited update** – This is something that had to be put on hold due to Covid pandemic. Richard Powell has spoken to Martin Creadland, and he is keen to arrange a date for the talk with Dr Peter Halkon to go ahead. It was suggested that the talk be held on Monday 16<sup>th</sup> May. Once everyone involved has confirmed the date, we will arrange to send out flyer asap.

**Parish Review** – Email received for ERYC asking on a preliminary basis whether our parish council is aware of any issues that it wishes to be considered as part of such review. Our concern is that Brough may want to consider moving the parish boundary to included Cave Road. Richard Meredith was going to discuss this with Brough Town Council and Richard Powell has spoken the clerk. The feedback is that this is not something they are considering.
